- Children may enter into classes above their age group
- Exhibits must arrive at the Fair from 6:30 pm to 9:30 pm on Thursday, September 1, 2022
- Exhibits are to be picked up between 4:00 pm and 5:30 pm on the last day of the Fair. (Exhibits not picked up by 5:30 will be kept in the Fair Board office). Please don't leave your child's beautiful work behind.

Classes:

Ages 3 & Under

- 1. An item that Grandma would like**
- 2. Paper plate - You Are My Sunshine**
Make a paper plate to look like a sunshine
- 3. Make a tree - Trace your arm and hand**
Colour and decorate it to look like a tree
- 4. "Look what I found at Grandma's house" - display it in a jar.**
- 5. Draw a heart**
Decorate it
- 6. Coloured picture with the letter G**
Picture can be printed or from a colouring book.
Put the letter G on it
- 7. Draw a picture of Grandma**

Ages 4 & 5

- 8. Draw and Colour "What I like to do at the fair"**
On paper 8 1/2" x 11"
- 9. Collect 3 things that remind you of Grandma**
Display in a box
- 10. Print the numbers 175**
on a page 8 1/2"x11" and decorate the page
- 11. Artwork - "A Button Flower"**
Make a flower out of buttons on an 8 1/2"x11" page
- 12. Dress a stuffed animal as a Grandma**
- 13. Paint and decorate a flower pot**
- 14. Write the word "Grandma"**
and decorate the 8 1/2"x11" page

Ages 6 to 8

- 15. Decorate a wooden spoon**
to look like your favourite animal
- 16. Lego farm machine**
ONE farm machine made from Lego (no kits

allowed). No larger than 10" x 10"

- 17. Make a paper flower**
- 18. Print 5 things found in Grandma's kitchen**
- 19. Create a bookmark using any material**
- 20. Print your 5 favourite things about Perth's 175th Fair**
On a paper 8 1/2" x 11" and decorate the page
- 21. Treasures from a walk**
display 6 items in a half egg carton

Ages 9 to 12

- 22. Handmade jewellery**
out of any medium
- 23. Collect 40 red and/or blue items to fit in a jar**
- 24. Create a mosaic sun catcher**
Using tissue paper
- 25. Build a Lego house**
No larger than 12" x 12", no kits allowed
- 26. Make a card for Grandma**
- 27. Collage of Flowers**
Completely covered with no writing or title on a 11"x14" page
- 28. Penmanship**
Print your Grandma's favourite recipe on 8 1/2" x 11" paper

Ages 13 to 15

- 29. Finish the Poem**
In 4- 6 lines
"I'm going to Perth's 175th Fair"
- 30. Pop bottle planter**
Use a 2 litre pop bottle to create a planter with a plant in it and decorate the bottle
- 31. Apron uses**
List 6 different uses for an apron on page 8 1/2"x11"
- 32. Lego - Build a ride or game from the fair**
No kits allowed. No larger than 12'x12'
- 33. Hardware person**

Use tin cans, bolts, nuts, screws, etc - not to exceed 18" in height

34. Bouquet of flowers

Make at least 6 flowers using any medium and display in a vase

35. Design a cookbook cover

And include a recipe from Grandma - no larger than 8 1/2"x11"

YOUTH POSTER COMPETITION - Original Hand Drawn Design

Entry Rules:

a) Theme: **"Promoting Your Fair" – Important****

Name and date of fair must be clearly shown on poster.

b) Must be hand drawn.

c) Poster size: -Minimum –22cm X 28cm, without border. -Maximum – 28cm X 44cm, without border.

d) Each entry must be centered on CARDSTOCK or BRISTOL BOARD exposing a 5.5 cm. border on all four sides.

e) Name of fair & owner of poster and complete mailing address to be clearly labeled on the back of each entry.

f) The winning poster from each class at each fair will be eligible to enter the district competition. District winners are eligible to enter at the provincial competition.

g) Judging Standards: Overall Appearance – 50 points Hand Drawn – 35 points OAAS Criteria (size, material, theme) – 15 points
