## 801. Junior Department

### Ages 3 & Under

#### Classes:

1. Draw and colour a picture of a sunflower on paper 8 1/2" x 11"
2. Use your handprint to make a sunflower on a paper plate
3. Collect 6 different things  
Put in a 6 section egg carton
4. Make a sunflower from playdough
5. Put 1 yellow item in a jar and write the letter S on the lid

7. Make an edible cereal necklace

### Ages 4 & 5

8. Make 3 Sunflowers using popsicle sticks  
Put in a pot
9. Collect 10 different yellow things  
Put in a jar and write the word SUN on the lid
10. Sunflower face  
Draw a sunflower with a face on a paper plate
11. Build something from Lego  
No larger than 10" x 10" including base - no kits allowed
12. Drawing of "ME"  
On a paper 8 1/2 x 11"

13. Bumble Bee  
Make a bumble bee from part of an egg carton

14. Make a pasta necklace

15. Bookmark  
Create a bookmark using any material, decorate with sunflowers
16. Collage  
Collage of both happy faces and sunflowers on paper 8 1/2" x 14" (completely covered with no writing or title)

17. "Me with my best friend"  
Draw a picture of "Me with my best friend" on paper 8 1/2" x 11"

18. Penmanship  
Print or cursive write the following in your best penmanship:  
Finish the sentence "At Perth Fair, I like \_\_\_\_\_"

19. Lego vehicle  
Create a lego vehicle no larger than 10" x 10" including base - no kits allowed

20. Sailboat  
Create a sailboat from half an egg carton

#### Extra Special

21. Rainbow  
Make a rainbow using buttons on heavy paper or cardboard

### Ages 9 to 12

22. Penmanship  
Print or cursive write the following in your best penmanship:  
I want to be a sunflower; so that even on the darkest days I will stand tall and find the sunlight
23. Lego Farm Machine  
Build a lego farm machine - no larger than 10" x 10" including base - no kits allowed
24. Clothespin sunflower  
Make a sunflower out of clothespins
25. Flip Flops  
Decorate a pair of flip flops
26. Sunflower acrostic  
Print an acrostic with the word Sunflower

#### Special

27. Egg Carton Sunflowers  
Create 3 sunflowers using part of an egg carton and put flowers in a decorated container

#### Extra Special

28. Thank you Card  
Make a thank you card showing this year's theme of sunflowers

### Ages 13 to 16

29. Lego Building  
Build a Lego building - no larger than 12" x 12" including base - no kits allowed
30. Penmanship - Sunflower Facts  
Print or cursive write the following 2 interesting facts of a sunflower & add a new fact that you know about sunflowers  
"It is the only flower with the word flower in its name  
People can eat the seeds"
31. Sunflower  
Make a sunflower from metal bottle caps and put on heavy paper or cardboard
32. Sunflower Picture  
Draw a picture of one or more sunflowers on paper 8 1/2" x 11"
33. Handmade Jewelry  
Handmade Jewelry from any medium

34. Colourful ocean  
Create a colourful ocean in half an egg carton
- Extra Special
35. Candy Wrapper story  
Create a candy wrapper story (at least 3 sentences) about the Perth Fair using at least 6 candy wrappers

## 802 Poster Contest

### Youth Poster Competition - Original Hand Drawn Design

Entry Rules:

- a) Theme: "**Promoting Your Fair**" – **Important\*\***  
Name and date of fair must be clearly shown on poster.
- b) Must be hand drawn.
- c) Poster size: -Minimum –22cm X 28cm, without border. -Maximum – 28cm X 44cm, without border.
- d) Each entry must be centered on CARDSTOCK or BRISTOL BOARD exposing a 5.5 cm. border on all four sides.
- e) Name of fair & owner of poster and complete mailing address to be clearly labelled on the back of each entry.

- f) The winning poster from each class at each fair will be eligible to enter the district competition. District winners are eligible to enter at the provincial competition.
- g) Judging Standards: Overall Appearance – 50 points Hand Drawn – 35 points OAAS Criteria (size, material, theme) – 15 points

Youth up to and including grade 4
2. Intermediate Poster  
Youth Grade 5 to Grade 8 inclusive
3. Senior Poster  
Grade 9 to Grade 12 inclusive

## 701. Flowers

**Do not use containers of value. The Perth and District Agricultural Society cannot be responsible for valuable containers**

### Hints for Exhibitors in the Flower Class

- All exhibits should be arranged attractively
- Cut flowers are to be shown with long stem and where possible, with foliage
- For taller stems and larger containers, the use of cedar is recommended to hold the stems in place. **Note:** Cedar is used as a filler and is not to show above the container edge
- Flowers should be as uniform as possible
- Remove debris from the pot
- Flowers and Plants must be **insect and disease free** to be eligible for judging
- In a floral arrangement, the large flowers and strong colours should be at the base

42. Fall Splendor  
An arrangement of Sunflowers and colourful fall materials found in your yard.  
Not to exceed 16"

## 702. Homebaking

All entries to be placed in clear zip-lock bags or plastic bags with twist ties.

- Securely attach tag to outside of bag, in a bottom corner.
- No commercial mixes or fillings to be used.

### JUDGING TIPS

- Bread - well proportioned; rounded crust with no cracks or bulges.
- Cookies - approx. 2-2 ½" round.
- Squares - approx. 1½" square, not cut from the outside edge of pan; holds shape when served.
- When submitting 3 cookies, rolls, muffins, etc. - uniform size; even colouring.

- Lids and tops must be NEW

46. Wrap and decorate any non-perishable food item  
Will be delivered to the local foodbank
47. Sewn sock puppet
48. Pair of shorts  
Sew a pair of shorts with elastic waist from any type of fabric
49. Scarf  
Knit any style of scarf
50. Bag  
Create any style of bag from recycled fabric

## 707. Photography

- Photographs will be judged on imagination, focus, exposure, composition and interest.
- Photographs must be taken by the exhibitor and not previously exhibited at Perth Fair.
- Only one entry per exhibitor permitted in each section
- Pictures can be either colour or black & white and can be up to 5" x 7" in size.
- Printed pictures MUST have a 1" (2.5cm) **WHITE** border around the image, using materials such as Bristol board or construction paper. Therefore, a 5"x 7" photo including the 1" (2.5cm) border will total 7"x 9" when mounted.

Best scarecrow for use in the garden. Not over 7' tall
