How to Enter:

Go to <https://www.assistexpo.ca/perthfair> and enter on-line or email, fax, mail or bring your entry form (not your entry) to the fair office. **You may also put your entry form in the mail slot in the door.**

You may only enter one item in each section.

Fill in the entry form with all the information requested. Birthdate is required for all Juniors.

Tags will be available after August 20th for those entries received by August 18th and must be **PICKED UP** at the office. **THEY WILL NOT BE MAILED.**

You must have a tag for each exhibit - it is best to order a tag for every section you think you might enter. If you do not use all of them, that is okay.

Bring your exhibit with the tag attached to the Homecraft building (crafts, baking & photography) or Agriculture Tent (grain & vegetables) at the fairgrounds on **Thursday, August 29th, between 6:30 p.m. & 9:30 p.m. ONLY.**

You must pick up your entries on Monday, September 2nd between 4:00 & 5:30 p.m.

All exhibits are the responsibility of the exhibitor. Articles must be new work - not shown before!

1. "Promoting Your Fair" – Name and date of fair must be clearly shown on poster.
2. Must be hand drawn.
3. Poster size: Minimum – approximately 22cm X 28cm, without border Maximum –approximately 28cm X 44cm, without border
4. Each entry must be centered on a CARDSTOCK or BRISTOL BOARD exposing approximately a 5.5cm border on all four sides.
5. Name of fair, owner of poster and complete mailing address must be clearly labelled on the back of each entry.
